Social scientists, national funding agencies and international organizations are increasingly interested in promoting international research collaboration in social research and analysis as a means to better understanding the global interconnections of economic, social, political and cultural life and to address pressing analytical and policy issues and problems which have global and local manifestations and ramifications.

While the recognition of the importance of enabling international collaboration among social scientists has led to the creation of different programs and projects of varying duration, as well as designating special funds by certain agencies, these efforts remain based in particular countries and agencies with little communication and collaboration on an organizational and international level. Most importantly there is little sharing of the learning which arises from these efforts on the challenges as well as the promises of collaborative research in the social sciences.

The conference will explore ways for promoting international collaboration around development-oriented research, as well as viewing research collaboration and capacity building as a development goal in itself. Central to this approach would be the aim of building bridges and cooperation between funding agencies that support development efforts in the Global South with funding agencies that support social science research in both the North and South. The participants to the workshop include representatives of different funding and research organizations.


